Mayor Nolls welcomed D. Ballek and L. Smith to the meeting.

D. Ballek introduced herself to Council as the new manager of Points West Living, having taken over the position in August 2021.

D. Ballek advised that she hoped to address concerns resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic, including level of care and staffing shortages. Points West is attempting to

find solutions to the staffing shortage, such as recruiting staff to take their health care aide education while working. Services such as laundry are only reduced when necessary, and are rescheduled for the next possible date. The Hospice is temporarily closed, but Points West is working with families to find suitable alternate solutions.

D. Ballek advised that she sends out regular newsletters to families to keep them informed of what is happening at Points West, and has requested to add members of Town Council to this mailing list.

As a Recreation Therapist, L. Smith advised that Points West practices the “Eden Alternative Philosophy.” The goal of the philosophy is to make the residence feel like a home and combat loneliness, boredom and helplessness among residents. This is done by using terminology such as “home” instead of “facility,” encouraging health care aides to socialize with the residents, allowing pets, facilitating programs with local children and more. Loneliness, boredom and helplessness is handled with connection, spontaneity, and respect.

L. Smith and D. Ballek thanked Town Council for the opportunity to visit and presented a scrapbook of “Eden Moments,” featuring residents from Points West.

Mayor Nolls thanked D. Ballek and L. Smith for their presentation.

D. Ballek and L. Smith left the meeting at 6:54 p.m.

6. **Administration:**

(a) Intermunicipal Development Plan Update

Mayor Nolls welcomed Director of Planning & Development L. Graham to the meeting.

L. Graham advised that in March 2020, the Town and County received the Alberta Community Partnership (ACP) Grant for \$200,000 under the Intermunicipal Component for an Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP) amendment and a new South East Area Structure Plan (SE ASP). Both plans are considered Statutory documents under the Municipal Government Act. The contract was awarded to Dillon Consulting in partnership with MPE Engineering.

Over the past number of months the Town and County have been working in partnership with Dillon Consulting to determine the IDP Vision changes including re-defined growth areas, expanding the CFO exclusion area and the referral areas. The IDP Committee including representatives from both Councils held a table top session to “map” out the proposed areas.

Further, Dillon has prepared a communications and engagement plan for moving forward. This plan includes the branding and themes of the collaboration between the Town and the County. The engagement for this project will be executed in two parts. Part 1 will focus on the IDP update. Information gathered in Part 1 will be utilized in Part 2, which will focus on the ASP.

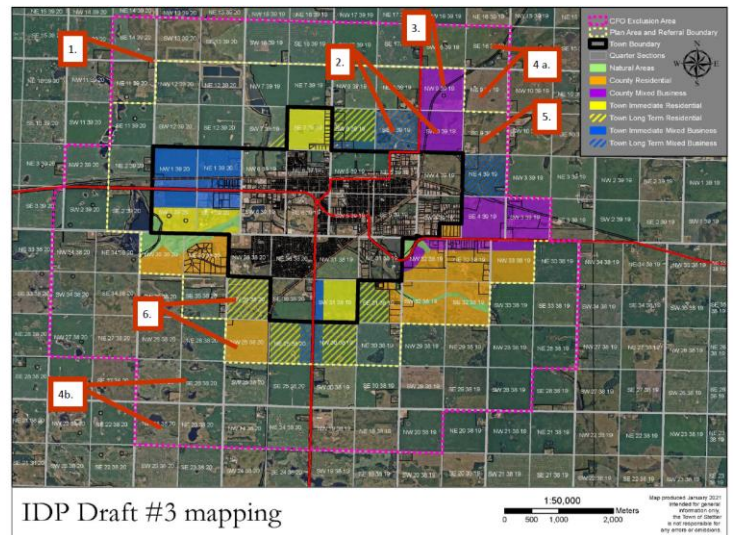
Working collaboratively with Town and County staff, Dillon proposed and refined the engagement approach associated with the development of the IDP and ASP. Engagement will lead participants in a future thinking and visioning process. The approach will focus on positive idea generation and future community visioning. The engagement approach will incorporate questions to help participants identify community assets, strengths and opportunities, while envisioning what the community could be. What we will hear will be used to develop the IDP and ASP. An outline of the approach, including potential survey questions, has been provided in the agenda package.

With Council support for this engagement plan and the survey themes outlined, the Round 1 engagement to support the IDP will launch on February 21, 2022. The survey will be promoted using social media, roadside signs, newspaper ad, and Stettler Local (including the 19 Stettler Community Screens). The survey will be posted on the Town and County websites, and will remain open for two weeks for community feedback. Survey Monkey will be used as the survey platform. Following the completion of the survey, the project team will evaluate what was heard and consider this information in the preparation of the IDP. In May 2022, open houses will be held to share the draft IDP with the public and ask for feedback, prior to the final draft being prepared for Council consideration.

The final draft IDP is anticipated to be brought to Council at the end of July, with public hearings held the first week of September.

- Summary of Changes:
1. Changes to Referral Area Boundary
    - Extending the referral area beyond the growth area boundaries as good planning practice and open communication along the growth area boundaries.
  2. Swap Town & County Business Growth Areas for development and servicing continuity
    - Staff discussion regarding the 2021 MOU, servicing of the Bioboard development and the desire for continuity in municipal servicing and development controls.
  3. Add County Business Growth Area as per MOU (BioBoard)
  4. Add 4 additional quarters to the CFO exclusion area, 2 on the NE and 2 on the SW.
  5. Remove Town Growth Area former landfill site.
    - Former landfill site poses development challenges, no development can take place within 300 meters of former landfill or an operating disposal area.
  6. Add Town and County Residential Growth Areas
    - Planning for long term residential within in vicinity of existing residential developments. This change is proposed in response to the previous proposal for an industrial use on these lands.

Dear Chief Elected Officials:

I am writing to share information with you about *Budget 2022*, which my colleague, the Honourable Travis Toews, has tabled in the Alberta legislature. You will find below some details about Budget 2022 that are most closely related to Alberta Municipal Affairs and the Alberta municipalities that we all continue to serve.

Alberta's government is investing approximately \$980 million overall to build stronger communities across our province. These funds will continue to deliver important programs and services, support effective governance, and protect public safety. Alberta is moving forward to a time of economic recovery and prosperity, where Albertans have opportunities to build their skills, pursue their passions, and support themselves and their families. That's why we are continuing to provide significant infrastructure funding in the near term to support our economic recovery, even as we help municipalities adjust to new funding levels.

As we discussed last year, Municipal Sustainability Initiative (MSI) capital funding is averaging \$722 million a year for three years, from 2021-2024. We front-loaded MSI funding for 2021-22 to a total of approximately \$1.2 billion, to help municipalities recover from the pandemic and provide flexibility to ensure priority capital projects could continue. As a result, MSI funding for 2022 and 2023 has been reduced proportionately to \$485 million each year. Additionally, municipalities and Metis Settlements will continue to receive \$30 million under the operating component of the MSI program.

The goal of this strategic, multi-year funding approach is to prepare for implementation of the Local Government Fiscal Framework in 2024-25. Our government passed the *Local Government Fiscal Framework (LGFF) Act*, paving the way for Municipal Affairs to establish a predictable, reliable, long-lasting funding arrangement with Alberta municipalities that is tied to provincial revenues. Baseline funding for the first year of the LGFF in 2024-25 will remain at \$722 million, equivalent to the current three-year average funding level of MSI. The estimated 2022 MSI allocations are available on the program website [here](#).

As you are also aware, the federal Gas Tax Fund changed its name and is now called the Canada Community-Building Fund (CCBF). Fortunately, the level of funding for Alberta has not changed, and we anticipate receiving approximately \$255 million from this federal fund again this year. The estimated 2022 CCBF allocations are available on the program website [here](#).

MSI and CCBF program funding is subject to the Legislative Assembly's approval of Budget 2022. Individual allocations and 2022 funding are subject to ministerial authorization under the respective program guidelines. Federal CCBF funding is also subject to confirmation by the Government of Canada. You should anticipate receiving letters confirming MSI and CCBF funding commitments in April.


I am pleased to inform you that funding in support of local public library boards will continue to remain stable, helping to deliver important literacy resources to Albertans. We are also maintaining equivalent levels of operational funding for other services, such as the Land and Property Rights Tribunal.

As we all look to the time ahead, I can tell you that Alberta's government understands the challenges and the opportunities that are facing Alberta communities. As we continue to recover from the pandemic and prepare for economic growth, Municipal Affairs remains committed to providing sustainable levels of capital funding, to promoting economic development, and to supporting local governments as they deliver programs and services that Albertans need.

Alberta is moving forward to a prosperous financial future, and Albertans are doing their part to get us there. Alberta's government will do its part by sticking to our fiscal plan. We will continue our disciplined spending to maintain balance, and we will continue to respect Albertans' tax dollars by keeping our spending in line with other provinces.

With our eyes on these goals, we will move forward to a bright, thriving, and prosperous future where Alberta firmly secures our place as the economic engine of our nation.

## Two new immigration streams will help rural communities grow by attracting skilled newcomers.

At the inaugural Premier's Summit on Fairness for Newcomers, Premier Jason Kenney announced the launch of the Rural Renewal Stream and the Rural Entrepreneur Stream. These streams will encourage skilled and talented professionals and entrepreneurs from around the world to settle in rural communities.

“One of the biggest challenges facing rural communities is population decline, which has caused a succession crisis when a retiring business owner cannot find an interested buyer. We are helping revitalize rural Alberta by removing barriers and setting the building blocks to welcome job-creating immigration to local communities and supporting economic growth throughout the province.”

With many Alberta rural communities struggling to find qualified professionals to meet their current and future workforce needs, the Rural Renewal Stream will help attract, welcome and retain newcomers who will contribute their skills and talent to grow local economies.

Eligible rural communities interested in receiving newcomers must apply to become a designated community. During the first year of this program, a limited number of communities will be selected to participate as a designated community.

Communities, represented by an economic development or similar organization, with approved applications will be able to begin working with employers and settlement providing organizations to attract newcomers and help them settle permanently in the community.

The Rural Entrepreneur Stream will attract immigrant entrepreneurs to rural Alberta communities to launch businesses that will create jobs and help stimulate economic recovery and growth.



Entrepreneurs interested in starting or buying a business in rural Alberta will be able to visit the communities so they can see where they will live and operate their business, and for the community to meet the entrepreneur and assess the business idea.

## **Alberta Advantage Immigration Strategy**

The rural immigration streams are part of the Alberta Advantage Immigration Strategy – a strategy to help attract global skills and talent to Alberta, diversify the provincial economy and get Albertans back to work.

The strategy will help create a smart, fast-moving immigration policy and help reclaim Alberta’s leadership in Canada when it comes to attracting and welcoming newcomers to our province.

“We need to make our province the destination of choice for skilled newcomers and entrepreneurs. Identifying ways to encourage more skilled newcomers to come to Alberta is the first step to increasing our competitiveness, growing our economy and restoring the Alberta Advantage.”

As part of the strategy, the Government of Alberta is renaming the Alberta Immigrant Nominee Program to the Alberta Advantage Immigration Program to help promote Alberta’s reputation and benefits as an attractive place when choosing where to work and raise a family.

According to the Conference Board of Canada, high levels of over-qualification among newcomers can limit the economic contributions and career prospects of immigrants. Immigrants often fill many essential roles in unregulated, lower-paid professions due to difficulties in getting their qualifications recognized.

To help address these challenges, the strategy includes the implementation of the Fairness for Newcomers Action Plan and key actions to enhance the participation of newcomers in Alberta’s economy and communities – from pre-arrival to settlement and integration.

“Many newcomers bring diverse and innovative skills, education, experience and business ideas to Alberta, only to face unnecessary roadblocks that lead them to work below their skill level. Today’s announcement lets us take advantage of untapped talent by making it easier for them to put their ideas to work in communities throughout Alberta.”

## **About the Rural Renewal Stream**

- To be eligible for the Rural Renewal Stream, communities must:
  - Have a community population of less than 100,000 and be outside Edmonton and Calgary Census Metropolitan Areas

- Be represented by an economic development or similar organization with a primary function in economic development
- Have an economic development plan
- Have expressed support from the town/municipality council and a local/regional settlement providing organization
- Have local employers with permanent, full-time, non-seasonal work available.

## Quick facts

- The new rural immigration streams are part of the Alberta Advantage Immigration Program, a federal-provincial program that nominates individuals for permanent residence in Alberta if they have skills to fill job shortages or are planning to buy or start a business in Alberta.
- Alberta's rural communities are facing challenges with fewer people of working age and population decline.
- Immigration helps to grow the population and labour force, but in 2018, less than a quarter (1,369 of 5,601) of the Alberta Advantage Immigration Program nominees settled in rural Alberta.
- The Alberta Advantage Immigration Program issued 6,250 nomination certificates to skilled and semi-skilled immigrants in 2021. This includes all immigration streams, not just the new rural immigration streams.
- According to the Conference Board of Canada, among newcomers, 45 per cent of nurse aides, orderlies, and patient service associates, 28 per cent of transport truck drivers and 34 per cent of process control and machine operators in food and beverage processing are overqualified. The levels of over-qualification for

non-immigrants in the same occupations are respectively 5.6 per cent, 1.6 per cent and 6.9 per cent.

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# Online services make life easier for Albertans

Alberta's government continues to reduce red tape by modernizing and streamlining services.

Since June 2020, when changes were introduced to make registry services more accessible, more than 350,000 transactions have been completed online.

"We've been working hard with industry partners to make sure Albertans have options that are flexible, convenient and modern. The increased use in online services is an important milestone as we continue to reduce red tape and make services more accessible."

Services can be completed anytime, anywhere, and Albertans are increasingly looking to complete these transactions online. For example, new parents can register the birth of their child and order their child's first birth certificate before they leave the hospital, or when they return home. Since changes were made, more than 83 per cent of all birth registrations and about 75 per cent of first birth certificate orders have been completed online.

The following registry services were brought online in 2020 and 2021:

- Birth registrations
- Birth certificate ordering
- Extra-provincial registration for corporations and limited partnerships across western Canada
- Name Search Report ordering
- Annual registration renewals for various vehicle types
- In-transit permit orders
- Specialty licence plate orders
- Standard and commercial driver's abstracts
- Vehicle information reports
- Duplicate vehicle registration certificates

MyAlberta Digital ID has been a key element for Alberta’s government to bring more services online. A verified MyAlberta Digital ID account allows Albertans to sign in, verify their identities using their driver’s licences or ID cards, and complete registry services without needing to visit a registry agent in person.

## Quick facts

- A verified MyAlberta Digital ID is required for online registry services except birth registration, birth certificate orders, and vehicle information reports.

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# Jobs and health care are focus of throne speech

Albertans will benefit from legislation this spring to create jobs, improve health care, keep streets safe and support the most vulnerable.

Bill 1, the *Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee Recognition Act*, celebrates the 70 years of Her Majesty's reign. The proposed bill would recognize this historic milestone by recognizing Albertans who have helped change this province for the better through volunteerism, public service and community leadership.

If passed, this legislation would:

- Establish awards and scholarships to recognize young Albertans who are leaders in their communities and in the arts.
- Establish a one-time Queen's Platinum Jubilee Medal to recognize 7,000 Albertans who have made significant contributions to society.

Highlights of the throne speech include:

- Creating jobs by moving forward with Alberta's Recovery Plan – a plan to create jobs, diversify the economy and create opportunities for every Albertan.
- Addressing cost-of-living pressures through a gas rebate program.
- Building health-care capacity so hospitals are better prepared for potential future waves of COVID-19.
- Accelerating the Alberta Surgical Initiative to reduce surgical wait times caused by COVID-19.
- Strengthening protection for Alberta students by ending the conflict of interest that allows the Alberta Teachers' Association to investigate its own members.
- Expanding school choice by creating more charter schools and improving support for existing charters.
- Increasing prenatal financial aid to mothers receiving AISH and Income Support.
- Implementing recommendations to improve palliative care.
- New legislation to modernize the electricity market.

- Legislation to better protect the public from individuals on bail, probation and parole.
- Legislation to reform and modernize the financial services sector by allowing reinsurance.
- Red tape reduction legislation to advance the goal of eliminating one-third of the provincial government's regulatory burden.
- Other legislation this session will take action on recommendations from the Police Act Review and the Human Trafficking Task Force.
- Recognizing Alberta's unique heritage, in part by naming the Terrace Building after Chief Poundmaker and erecting a memorial to the victims of residential schools on the legislature grounds.

"This session begins at a critical time for Alberta. We are carefully lifting COVID-19 health restrictions and we're seeing a strong economic turnaround that is bringing jobs and investment to our province. The government's spring legislative agenda will seize this opportunity and firmly establish Alberta as the best place in the world to work, live, start a business and raise a family."

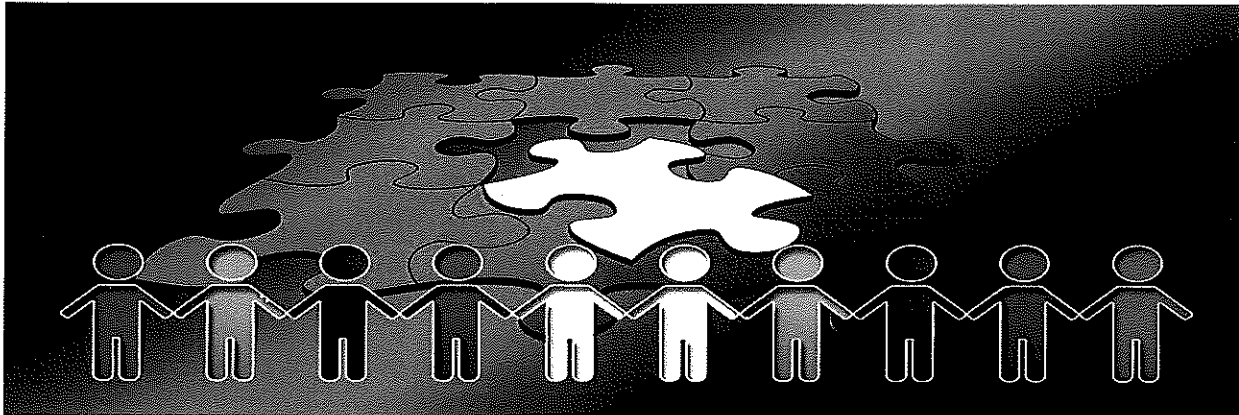

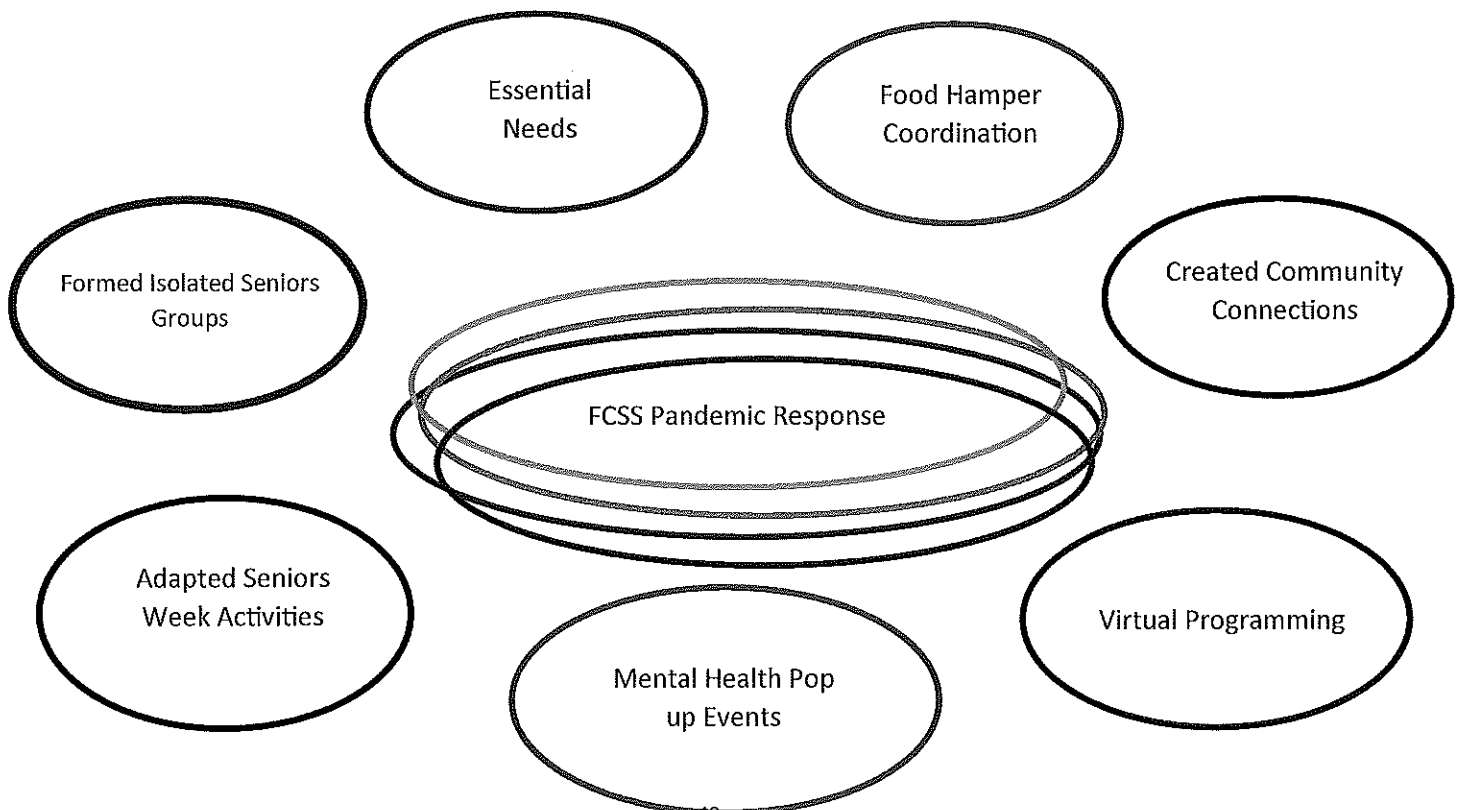
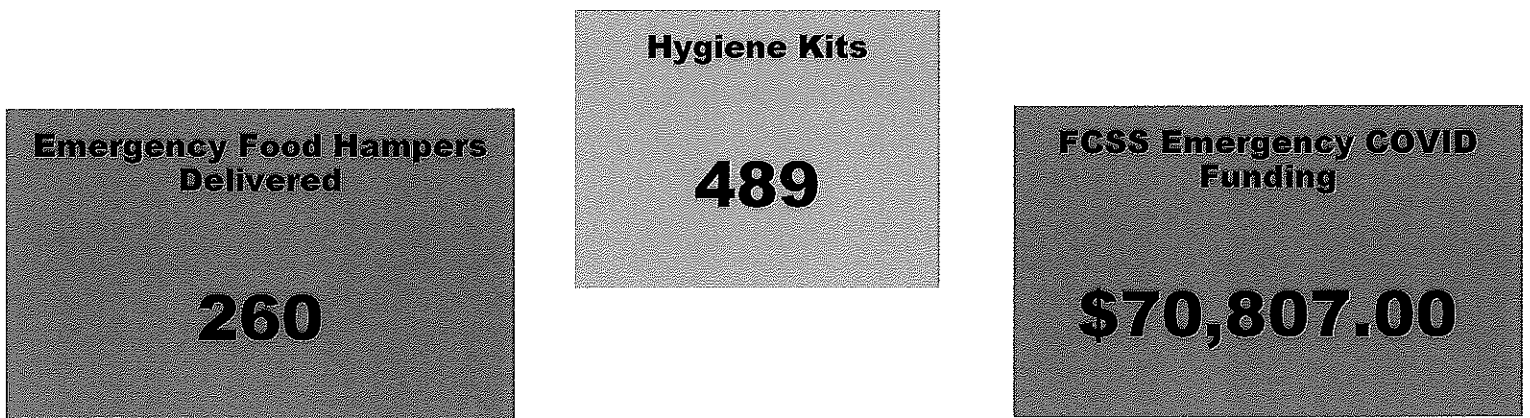

# Our COVID-19 Response

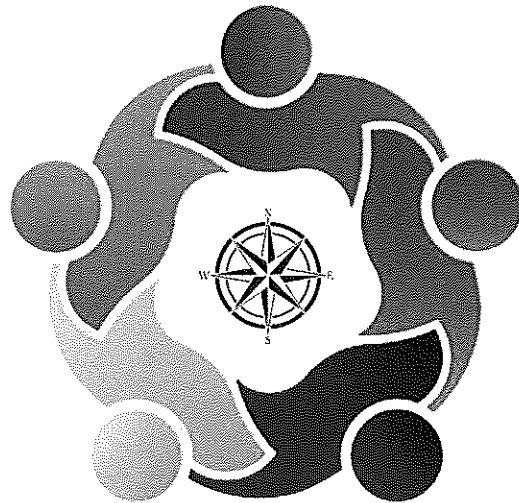

- Increased capacity of community to support one another’s mental health

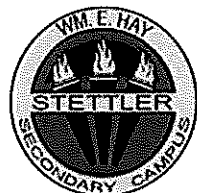

Harm Reduction is an evidence-based, client-centered approach that seeks to reduce the health and social harms associated with addiction and substance use, without necessarily requiring people who use substances from abstaining or stopping. Included in the harm reduction approach to substance use is a series of programs, services and practices. It is essential that a harm reduction approach provides people who use substances a choice of how they will minimize harms through non-judgmental and non-coercive strategies in order to enhance skills and knowledge to live safer and healthier lives.

Harm reduction acknowledges that many individuals coping with addiction and problematic substance use may not be in a position to remain abstinent from their substance of choice. The harm reduction approach provides an option for users to engage with peers, medical and social services in a non-judgmental way that will 'meet them where they are.' This allows for a health oriented response to substance use, and it has been proven that those who engage in harm reduction services are more likely to engage in ongoing treatment as a result of accessing these services. Some harm reduction initiatives have also reduced blood borne illnesses such as HIV/AIDS and Hepatitis C, and have decreased the rates of deaths due to drug overdoses.



Naloxone kits are portable pouches containing an opioid antidote that can be administered by injection or through the nose to revive an unresponsive person who is overdosing. The kits include enough medicine to reverse opioid overdoses for 10-15 minutes, allowing time to access emergency services.



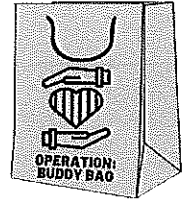
Respondents who were found to be objectively housing insecure, identified the following reasons as main contributing factors to their living situations: 15 responses for "I can't afford rent/mortgage payments"; 13 for "I don't make enough money"; 10 for "Mental health issues"; 10 for "Illness/Medical condition", and 10 for "My house needs major repairs".

An additional 21 dependents were reported to share these living conditions, along with 41 adults. In total, there are 95 individuals within Stettler that are either living in insecure housing conditions or sharing these conditions with respondents.

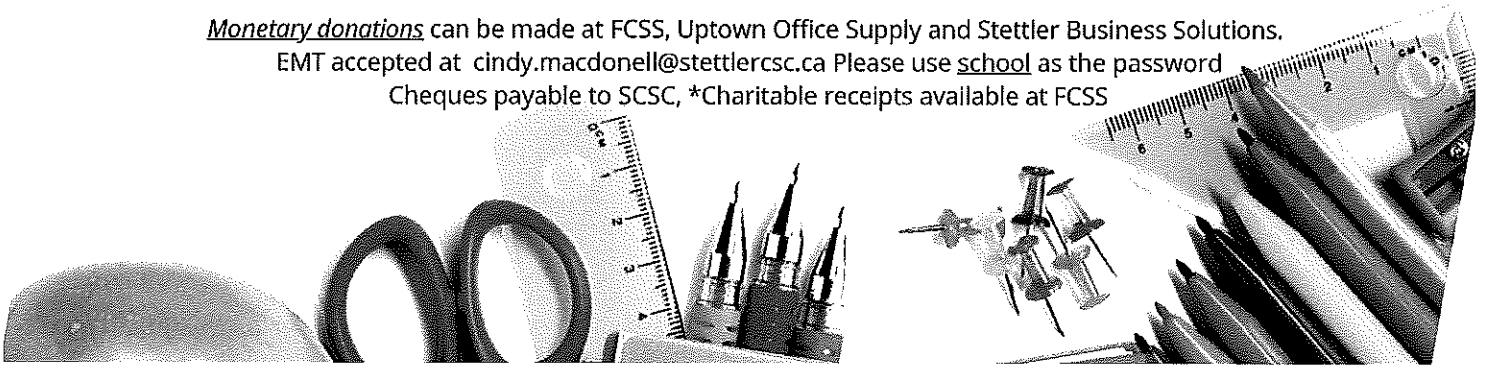

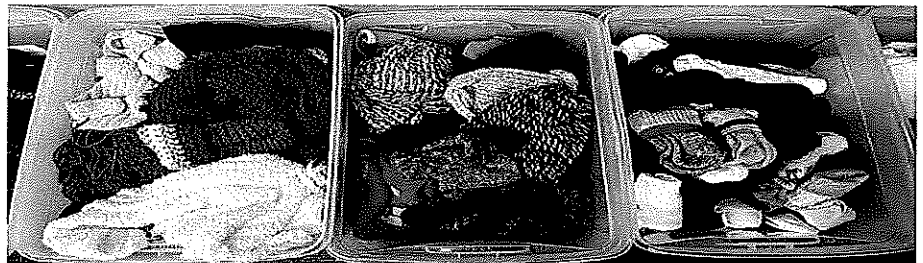

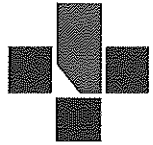
